Foodservice Solutions with a Local Flavor

March 8 - 19, 2010



Markets - Low pressure weather returns to California and rain and cool temps continue to hit CA making for quite a winter all the way from coast to coast. Everything out of CA is higher with citrus the exception. The Yuma **Iceberg** deal goes on through March, Huron production starts late March. Things from Florida (**peppers, cucumbers, eggplant, squash and tomatoes**) are sky high and offshore things are scarce, especially Chilean fruit. This is, of course, due to earthquake infrastructure disruptions. **Spanish onions** have gone crazy due to a sizeable availability gap. The northwest crop, which was smaller this year, wound down early. Mexico is so light that what is normally an export time of year is now an import time. Their crop usually supplies the heavy demand of **onions** in Mexico and then gets shipped this time of year to cover the period between our northwest crop and Texas. Texas which really hasn't gotten going yet, is going to have to handle the bulk of our domestic needs which means **onions** will be in a red hot market likely into June when California **onions** come on. Plenty of **small potatoes** to go around, but bigger is a bit tighter.

Avocados – Chilean done, Mostly Mexican, California gaining volume but holding back as fruit sizes up, steady market



Broccoli - Supplies lighter, Market moving higher

Carrots - Good supply and quality out of Bakersfield, lower market

Cauliflower - Trading active, light supply, market higher, quality fair



Iceberg Lettuce - Market much higher, Yuma deal winding down with less than ideal growing conditions and quality

Leaf Lettuce - Very active, quality is an issue

Celery – Market active on all sizes,

Oranges – Good demand, mostly fancy fruit, choice is tight



Lemons - Small foodservice sizes are tight, supply and quality very good

Melons - Market is strong on light supplies

Spuds - Demand light, long market, peaking on 70 ct to 90 ct, shippers are dealing on small sized

Onions - Market much stronger, crop light and winding down, Mexico very light in supply



Strawberries - Poor quality and supply due to rains, market strong
